until unconditional discharge, defendant will have no direct or indirect contact with (unpublished); May only have contact with (unpublished) by telephonic means, with (unpublished) consent: cease contact at (unpublished) request; Surcharges due; Submit DNA; Probation for 3 years (date of Judgment: 1/15/26); Comply with all direct court orders listed above by the deadlines stated; Obey all state, federal, and local laws and ordinances; Do not consume or buy alcohol at all during probation period; Any driver's license or state ID is subject to cancellation under cited AS; Any new license or state ID must list the cited AS alcohol buying restriction until the restriction expires; Other: Submit to warrantless search for alcohol at request of law enforcement officer on probable cause of alcohol violation; Obtain alcohol assessment and follow treatment recommendations; Submit proof of completion to court within 1 year.
