Sexual Abuse Investigation: In January 2026, the Alaska Bureau of Investigation received a tip that 48-year-old Nome resident Ulric Jeffery Ulroan sexually abused a 17-year-old girl in Chevak between 2009 and 2010. During the course of the investigation, additional women came forward and reported that Ulroan sexually assaulted and/or abused them. Ulroan was a certified foster parent from 2005 to 2023 and has previously served as a high school girls basketball coach.

On June 23, 2026, a Bethel Grand Jury returned an indictment charging Ulroan with 47 counts, including Sexual Assault in the First Degree, Sexual Abuse of a Minor in the First Degree, Sexual Abuse of a Minor in the Second Degree, Indecent Exposure in the Second Degree, and Furnishing Alcohol to a Person Under 21. These charges relate to allegations that Ulroan sexually assaulted and/or abused various teenage girls between 2009 and 2025 in Chevak, Anchorage, Mountain Village, and Nome.

On June 24, 2026, Ulroan was arrested and remanded to Anvil Mountain Correctional Center.

The Alaska State Troopers believe that there could be additional victims. If you have information that would aid this investigation, please contact the Alaska State Troopers at (907) 451-5100.

Unalakleet

Assault 3, MIW4: On June 6, 2026, several people reported an assault that occurred in Unalakleet during afternoon of June 6, 2026. Rashawn M. Foxglove, 34, of Unalakleet reportedly threatened several people with a revolver by pointing the gun at them at a house near Main Road and L Street. Foxglove was intoxicated at the time of the assault.

On June 28, 2026, ABI served a search warrant at Foxglove's house and seized the firearm involved in the crime. Foxglove was at the house and, she was arrested pursuant to an arrest warrant for two counts of Assault in the 3rd Degree, and one count of Misconduct Involving Weapons in the 4th Degree.

ABI remanded Foxglove to AMCC.

Permit: AKG371000 – Medium Size Suction Dredge Placer Miners General Permit

Permit Coverage: The permit authorizes discharges of wastewater from suction dredges with intake diameters greater than six inches and less than or equal to ten inches that process gold placer ores and rely on beneficiation processes based on gravity separation. The permit provides statewide coverage for discharges to waters of the U.S., with certain limitations.
